

# Fort Hunter Liggett

## Rules for Hiking/Cycling

A. Individuals desiring to utilize open and designated training areas for hiking and/or cycling activities must comply with the following rules:

### Scheduling/Access:

- Only training areas identified as open and available in iSportsman will be used for both hiking and cycling.
- Must complete the “UXO Brief” (1) and “Orientation Brief”(2) on iSportsman prior.
- Prior to access, ensure training area is scheduled in iSportsman.
- All adults must have a permit through iSportsman and check-in and check-out through iSportsman individually.
- Minors (under 18) do not require a permit, but they must be added as a guest to your check-in by name and birthdate.
- Check-out will be no later than two hours after sunset.

### Hiking and cycling rules:

- Cyclists must wear helmets.
- Remain on roads or trails.
- Have cell phone in case of emergency and have numbers for FHL Dispatch and Range Operations Fire Desk: FHL DES Dispatch (831) 386-2513/2526 and Range Fire Desk (831) 386-2503.
- **DO NOT** enter areas marks by Siebert stakes.

Example of a Siebert stake



- **DO NOT** disturb or harass wildlife.
- No collection of anything (i.e. plants, soil, wildlife, minerals, archaeological items).
- No swimming in waterways.
- No littering. All trash will be removed by hikers/cyclists.
- No smoking.
- No alcohol.
- No fires.
- No entering hard structures or training facilities. Stay well clear of all such facilities.
- No unmanned aerial systems unmanned aerial vehicles, or drones of any time in the training areas.  
*Federal law restricts flights of all systems on Department of Defense (DoD) property without meeting DoD requirements in addition to Installation Commander's authorization.*
- All military training vehicles have the right of way.
- Do not approach or interfere with military training or military activities.
- No photographing or video taping of military training.

B. Failure to adhere to these rules will result in exclusion from future hiking and cycling activities on Fort Hunter Liggett.
